In order to provide a wide range of program experiences and perspectives, we started the Study Abroad Peer Mentor program as a resource for students who want to learn more about the study abroad experience.

Qualifications:

- Currently enrolled as an undergraduate at UW-L
- Be in good academic standing
- Participated in a UW-L Sponsored study abroad program (recently returned preferred)
- Interested in promoting study abroad and international education
- MUST be enthusiastic and have an open mind
- Have good verbal and written communication skills
- Be detail oriented and resourceful

Responsibilities:

As a Peer mentor, you will serve as the first point of contact for students interested in studying abroad. As a program alumnus, you are also the resident expert for your study abroad program. Therefore, you are the best resource there is! You will be responsible for providing students with information about your program, as well as have a general knowledge La Crosse Study Abroad programs and of Office of International Education policies and procedures.

Peer Mentors generally serve their office hours in the Office of International Resource Area; however, may be asked on occasion to assist with activities outside of the office including, but not limited to:

- Conducting information sessions for hall councils, student organizations, or classes
- Attend pre-departure Orientation program and facilitate program specific break-out session
- Represent your study abroad program at the Study Abroad Fair
- Keep up-to-date on program changes and other information
- Assist with campus visitors
- Research and learn about new study abroad opportunities
- Other duties that may be assigned, relating to study abroad or international education (we welcome your suggestions!)

Requirements/Expectations:

All Study Abroad Peer Mentors who are selected are required to attend the Peer Mentor training prior to starting their hours in the office. Peer Mentors must also be able to serve a minimum of 2 hours per week in the office in order to boost their outreach to students and also to provide consistency with program representation.
